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Description of activity

The collection of sets of instruments from schools engaging in WCIT or Group instrumental provision.


Existing control measures

	Hazard	Who is at risk?	Control measure(s)	Who is responsible?
1	Airborne transmission	Everyone	Distancing is normally accounted for by generously-sized accommodation, and instruments stored away from pupils/busy areas.	SFE staff in liaison with school staff.
2	Surface transmission via handling of instruments	Everyone	Pupils have their own designated instrument and (for most) a labelled case.	SFE staff in liason with school staff.
3	Surface transmission via other means	Everyone	Contact with surfaces, such as chairs, tables, door handles etc. is kept to a minimum.	SFE staff in liason with school staff.

Initial risk rating

The rating relates to the likelihood of risk of infection, as well the severity of consequences as it is currently perceived. It should be noted that this severity score for Covid-19 will vary according to factors such as age and additional underlying conditions, such as asthma, diabetes, etc. For the purposes of an overall viewpoint, an average score has been estimated. 1 = Least Likely/Severe, 5 = Most Likely/Severe.
